DOES THE INCARNATION REALLY MATTER?

1. The incarnation reveals the dignity of human nature.

The incarnation highlights for us that we are made in the image of God. God is able to take the form of a human being because humans are able by design to reflect the life of God.

2. The incarnation measures the immeasurable love of God.

The marvel of the incarnation is that the eternal Son of God assumed the form of a man in order to rescue us from sin, suffering and death.... Thomas Watson was right when he said, "Christ incarnate is nothing other than love covered with flesh."

3. The incarnation illumines the sacredness of the cross.

If Jesus is not God, the cross is unspectacular. If Jesus is simply a martyr, he is forgettable. But Jesus is God, ... enfleshed as a human being. The more we appreciate the incarnation, the more we will marvel at the cross.

4. The Incarnation reveals the essence of spirituality

Our greatest fulfilment [comes] by yielding ourselves completely to God. Although we cannot replicate the unique person of Christ, we can learn from him what it means to be truly human. I am most myself when I am most yielded to God.
