ISAIAH 43: 18-19 NIRV

"Forget the things that happened in the past.

Do not keep on thinking about them.

¹⁹ I am about to do something new.

It is beginning to happen even now.

Don't you see it coming?

I am going to make a way for you to go through the desert.

I will make streams of water in the dry and empty land.

Our memories/ 'forgetteries' are quite hard to control. Trying NOT to think of things just causes us to think about them all the more. The Bible more often instructs us to REMEMBER things – remember all the way God has led and guided & provided for us in the past. We are commanded to remember the sacrifice Jesus made for us on the cross, a 'once-for-all' action which secures our forgiveness for all that is past and provides for a glorious and certain future for us with God in Christ by the Holy Spirit. As we move into 2026, we need to be discerning and intentional about our forgetting and remembering. Let us:

Forget our faults & sins but remember God's forgiveness and what it cost him - and say thank you.

Forget our mistakes, but remember the lessons and God's wise 'sorting out' and where to find it (in prayerful reading of Scripture and Holy Spirit guidance) - And say thank you.

Forget our hurts and humiliations but remember God's comfort and care - and say thank you.

Forget our disappointments and despair. But remember God's eternal plan for our good and not for harm. And say thank you!

Dear Lord God, help us in this New Year to forget, or at least, not to keep thinking about things which you want us to forget, and to remember all that you want us to remember. Thank you that you are able to do this for us. Grow us as your disciples so that we can be good, practical examples for others to follow. Please heal our memories and train our 'forgetteries'. Thank you for all the blessings of the past. We trust you for all that is to come. In Jesus' Name. Amen.


