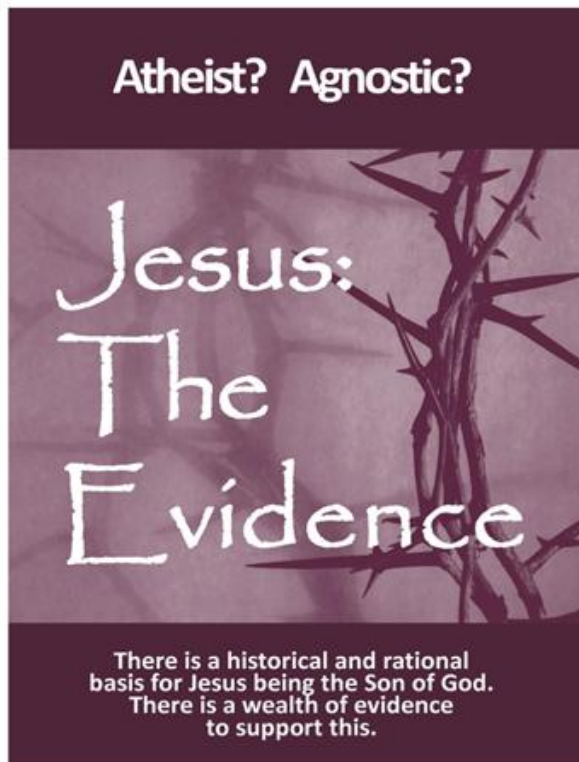

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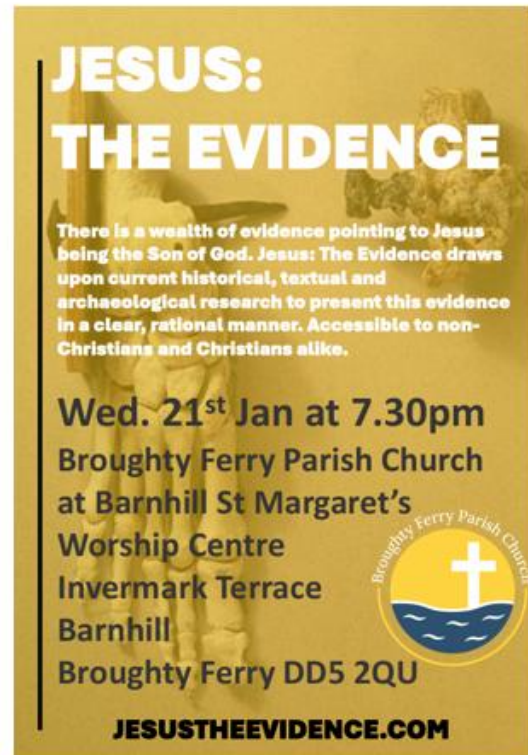

What Does a Jesus: The Evidence Event Look Like?

A Jesus: The Evidence event typically consists of two, 40 minute sessions reviewing the historical and rational basis for Jesus being the Son of God - drawing upon the latest historical, textual and archaeological research and clear, rational argument. There is also an opportunity to ask questions at the end of the presentation. **A free 70 page booklet** is also provided to each attendee at the end of each evening.
